“Look at the birds of the air; they do not sow or reap or store away in barns, and yet your heavenly Father feeds them. Are you not much more valuable than they?”



Creation Reflection

Optional Activity: Create a Nature Collection Box

Turn a simple cardboard box or shoebox into your own Creation Collection display.

What You Need

- A cardboard box or shoebox
- Scissors or a pencil for poking holes
- Tape or glue
- Markers, paint, or stickers
- Nature treasures from outside

How to Make It

1. Carefully poke small holes around the sides and top of the box.
2. Decorate the outside with drawings, flowers, Bible verses, bees, birds, or leaves.
3. Place flowers, leaves, feathers, and grasses through the holes to create a nature display.
4. Store special treasures inside the box like rocks, pinecones, shells, or journal notes.
